- (v.1) The wife of a man from what group? She cried out to whom?
- (v.1) What had happened to her husband? Who did her husband revere?
- (v.1) What was his creditor coming to do?
- (v.2) What did she have in her house?
- (v.3) Elisha told her to ask what group? For what? Ask for how many?
- (v.4) She was told to go where? Shut what? Behind whom?
- (v.4) She was told to do what with the oil? As each was filled, she was told to do what with it?
- (v.5) Her sons brought what to her? She kept doing what?
- (v.6) When all the jars were filled, she asked her son to do what? When there were no jars left, what happened to the oil?
- (v.7) She went and told whom? What did he tell her to do with the oil? Pay what?
- (v.7) The woman and her sons could now do what?

Thoughts to ponder:

In verse 7, Elisha is identified as a "man of God." What do you think the phrase being a "man of God" means?

Why did the oil stop flowing?

If she had had more jars, what do you think would have happened?

Why do you think God chose to help this woman in this way?

How does this story demonstrate the idea of faith?
