Lesson is from Joshua 24:14-15

- (v.14) Fear Whom? Serve the Lord how?
- (v.14) Throw away what of your forefathers?
- (v.14) Where had they worshiped these "gods"? Serve Whom?
- (v.15) If serving the Lord seems what? Then do what this day?
- (v.15) Whether the gods their forefathers served where?
- (v.15) Or whether the gods of what group of people? In whose land you are doing what?
- (v.15) But as for what two?
- (v.15) We will do what?

Thoughts to ponder:

Why is it important to "fear the Lord" (revere, respect, obey, show honor)? What does "serve Him with all faithfulness" mean personally to you? How does getting rid of 'gods' demonstrate to God your commitment to Him? Are there any ways that serving God would prove undesirable to you? What does "choose for yourselves 'this day" mean to you? Joshua said that he and his household will make the choice to do what? How can we help our 'household' to make the decision to serve the Lord?
