(For this lesson, if possible, use the 1984 New International Version)

Lesson is from Acts 9:19-31

- (v.19) In Damascus, Saul spent several days with what group?
- (v.20) At once he began to do what? Preach where? What did he preach?
- (v.21) Those who heard him asked if he was the one who had done what in Jerusalem?
- (v.22) How did he baffle the Jews in living in Damascus?
- (vv.23-24) Who conspired to kill Saul? What did they do day and night?
- (v.25) What group helped him? How did they help him?
- (v.26) He went to what place? He tried to join what group? Why were they afraid of him?
- (v.27) Who took him to the apostles? He told them Saul had seen Whom? He told them that in Damascus Saul had preached how in the Name of the Lord?
- (vv.28-29) Saul talked and debated with what group? What was their reaction?
- (v.30) What group learned of effort to harm Saul? Where did they first take Saul? They eventually sent him to what place?
- (v.31) Then the church throughout what 3 locations? Enjoyed what?
- (v.31) Who encouraged the church? What grew in numbers? Living how?

What do you see as Saul's main emphasis whenever he preached?

Why do you think Saul was so determined to preach even as he faced intense opposition?

Why do you think it is so difficult for the disciples in Jerusalem to first accept Saul?

How was Barnabas able to convince the disciples that Saul was a genuine disciple?

Why do you think the church needed the encouragement of the Holy Spirit?
