

QUICK LESSON FOR THOSE ON THE GO

(For this lesson, if possible, use the 1984 New International Version)

Lesson is from Acts 10:9-23

(v.9) Peter went where? He went there to do what? About what time was it?

(v.10) Peter became what? While the meal was being prepared, what happened to Peter?

(v.11) Peter saw what place opened? What did he see being lowered?

(v.12) The sheet contained all kinds of what? As well as what other two?

(v.13) Peter heard a voice telling him to get up and do what?

(v.14) Why did Peter say, “Surely not, Lord!”?

(v.15) Peter was told not to call what impure?

(v.16) How many times did this happen? Immediately what happened?

(vv.17-18) Who arrived at the house where Peter was staying?

(vv.19-20) Who told Peter the men were looking for him? He was told not to do what?

(vv.21-22) The men had come from whom? This man was respected by whom? What reason is given as to why Peter was to go and see Cornelius?

(v.23) What did Peter then do?

Thoughts to ponder:

FYI. Peter is a Jew. Cornelius is a Gentile (non-Jew). A Jew would become “unclean” in God’s eyes if he was in the very close proximity of a Gentile, had a Gentile come into his house, or eat a meal with a Gentile.

Does God want all the peoples of the world to hear the Gospel (note Mark 15:15; Matthew 28:19; Acts 1:8)?

Why do you think God wanted Peter and Cornelius to meet?

Why did God show Peter the sheet containing what Peter thought were impure and unclean animals and such? Why three times?

How could Peter now invite these Gentile men to be his house guests?
